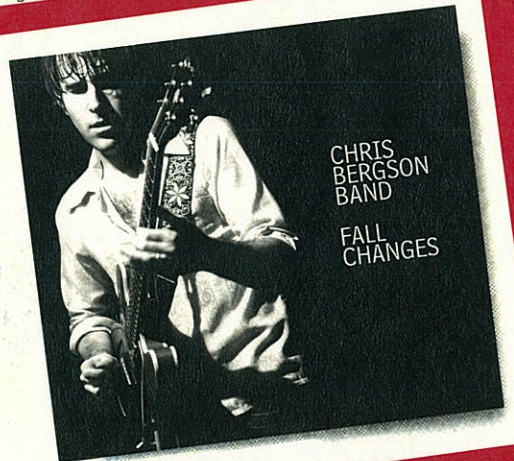
3 SICKNESS OBITUARY

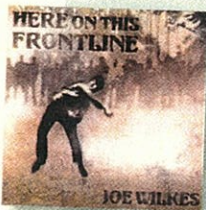
5 GOWANUS HEIGHTS CHRIS BERGSON BAND
